## KIRKBURTON PARISH COUNCIL MINUTES OF THE PARISH COUNCIL MEETING HELD AT BURTON VILLAGE HALL, HIGHBURTON ON THURSDAY, 6<sup>th</sup> DECEMBER 2012 AT 7.30 pm

Apologies were received from Cllrs H Barraclough, Bradbury, Cooper, Edmunds, 170 Apologies and Hardcastle, Lumb, Pankhurst, Triggs and Whittingham. **Declarations of** Interest The Clerk advised of changes with regard to the exemption of the need to declare interests in respect of the precept-setting following the enactment of the Localism Act 2011. She reported that she had received YLCA advice that NALC was still considering the implications of the changes and unless information is received to the contrary from NALC, it is not necessary for members to seek dispensations before taking decisions on the precept. The following personal interests were declared: Cllr S Beresford in the Grants and Community Projects item as he is a trustee of Lepton Highlanders; Cllr N Berry in planning applications 93279 as he knows the applicant and 93385 as he knows the architect; Cllr R Burton in the Grants and Community Projects item as he knows the applicants of the Lepton grants; Cllr P Cunnington in planning applications 93044 as he is a member of the Yorkshire Wildlife Trust and also 93388 as he knows the applicant; Cllr S Dunford in planning application 93509 as she knows the applicant; Cllr J Paxton in the Grants and Community Projects item as he is a trustee of Flockton Cricket Club; Cllr A Munro in planning application 93339 as she knows the headmistress and staff of the school. Cllr R Barraclough declared a personal interest in planning application 93591 as he knows the applicant. He also declared an interest in all the planning applications as he is a member of the KMC Heavy Woollen Planning Committee and stated that any views expressed would be of a preliminary nature with the final decision being taken at the Committee meeting when in receipt of full information.

Members had a lengthy discussion regarding planning application 2012/93008: Installation of a A29-225 kw wind turbine on a 50m tubular tower in Flockton.

**Resolved:** The Parish Council to object to the development on the following grounds: a visual amenity and an eyesore (the proposed wind turbine is far too big for the site proposed and completely inappropriate); shadow flicker, noise pollution; security; environmental impact – the proposed area is a feeding ground for bats; local rural businesses are not being supported by this development and there will be a negative impact on local tourism.

Members noted the written Management & Finance Committee's recommendations for the budget and precept for 2013-14 from the meeting held on  $22^{nd}$  November 2012. The Clerk reported on the Management & Finance Committee's recommendations made at the meeting immediately before Council, which were to put £10,000 into a Shelley Village Hall budget specifically for the repairs, a reduction of £5,000 from each of the Community Projects and Environment budgets and an increase in the precept of  $2\frac{1}{2}$ % to restore the level of the General Reserve

**Resolved**: To hold the discussion of the following item in a private session as it involved divulging details of contracts subject to future tendering processes.

The Clerk gave full details of the Structural Engineer's report on various repairs needed at Shelley Village Hall, which the Council had previously agreed to undertake as part of the sale contract. She also explained the expected future implications of the Finance Bill, which members considered.

**Resolved**: To accept the written budget proposals as presented with the following amendments: To put £10,000 into a Shelley Village Hall Repairs budget and to remove £10,000 from the sum allocated to Fruit Trees in the Allocated Reserves.

A recorded vote was taken on the proposal to increase the precept by  $2\frac{1}{2}$ % with the following outcome:

For:Cllrs Burton, Cunnington, Munro, Paxton and Pitts.Against:Cllrs Armer, Berry, Brook, Dunn, Hirst, Thomas and Wightman.Abstentions:Cllrs R Barraclough, Beresford, Dunford and Parsley.

The motion was therefore lost and a vote was taken on the proposal to maintain the precept at  $\pounds 122,000$  with a budgetted expenditure of  $\pounds 135,883$ .

Resolved: To levy a precept of £122,000 with an a budgetted expenditure of £135,883.
