The Parish Council is pleased to announce that it is working with the Yorkshire Ambulance Service and Denby Dale & District Rotary Club to provide additional defibrillators in the community, over the course of the next few years. It is hoping to move those currently located within health centre buildings to an outside wall, and also to install new equipment on buildings such as village halls, shops, sports clubs, etc so they will be available whenever they are needed. If you own or manage a suitable building and are

willing to discuss installing equipment on your wall, please get in touch. The order of the villages will be determined in accordance with perceived risk and on the advice of the YAS.

Small Annual Grants / Community Project Grants /Start-Up Grants Deadline : 31 October 2014

It's the grants season again! It's time to download your application form, request one from the office or from your local Councillor. They are also available on the window sill at Burton Village Hall.



Small Annual Grants: Most voluntary / not-for-profit groups in the area are entitled to up to £750 over 3 years – the 3 years counted are the year of application and the 2 preceding ones (the cheques were issued in April 2014 and April 2013). If you are unsure how much you can apply for, please ask the staff who will be happy to help you. The deadline for receiving completed forms with the necessary supporting information is Friday 31 October 2014. Late applications will be automatically refused, without exception.

Community Project Grants are for larger projects, and must have a minimum total project cost of $\pounds 3,000$. The maximum award is up to 50% of the total project cost. Forms are available from your Councillors, the website and the office.

Start-Up Grants are to help new groups to buy their new equipment and get organised. To qualify your organisation must have been in operation for less than a year at the meeting date. The start of operations is defined as the date the first bank account was opened.

If you have any queries, please contact the Clerk who will be happy to help you with your application.

Environment Grants: The deadlines for environment grant applications are 9 January & 6 March. Projects must meet at least one of the Objectives included in the Council's Environment Plan. Forms and copies of the Plan are available from the website, the office and also from your local Councillor.

Since starting out in 1998 Kirkburton JFC have led the way for South Huddersfield clubs in terms of offering a safe and friendly environment for youngsters to enjoy football. The teams play in all age groups from U5 through to U18 in the Huddersfield Junior Football League and girls-only teams play in the West Riding Junior Girls League. There are also good links with Kirkburton Senior AFC, which offers opportunities for local youngsters wishing to develop and play beyond junior level. *Last year's U11 team is pictured left*.

The homeground at Kirkburton Middle School, Turnshaw Road, has excellent facilities in terms of pitches and a clubhouse, which provides refreshments to supporters whilst they are cheering on their team. The Club holds the Charter Standard Community status due to its operations being of a higher standard than the FA recommended guidelines, which covers areas such as having qualified coaches, a structured committee and making a high standard of child protection the highest priority. The Club also works with the local community.

Following the recent expansion there are now vacancies available for more young people of all ages from Reception age upwards to play football, have fun and make new friends. Training takes place on Saturdays throughout the Summer between 10:30 and 11:30 at Kirkburton Middle School. As autumn approaches, Councillors' minds turn towards the budget and the spending plans for the next financial year. The Management & Finance Committee considers the proposals first towards the end of November, with the Council taking the final decisions at the December Parish Council meeting. The process takes place so far in advance of the start of the financial year, as there are time restrictions in notifying Kirklees Council of the amount to be collected from the Council taxpayers on behalf of the Parish Council.



More Dog Wastebag Dispensers Installed

The Council is continuing to try to reduce the amount of dog fouling within the Parish. Dispensers have been installed in two phases across the Parish in locations identified as known problem areas, and a further 2 dispensers have been agreed for both Lepton and Shepley following requests from local residents. Grants Awarded So Far this Year:



Community project grants of $\pounds 2,500$ each have been awarded to the Leslie Sport Foundation for new equipment, and Shepley Cricket Club towards the costs of a new boiler. (*Players from Shelley FC are pictured at the facility provided by the Foundation in Storthes Hall.*)

A start-up grant of £100 was awarded to Shepley Beavers.

An environment grant of £644 to Huddersfield Civic Society to help with the costs of restoring the inscription on the memorial of Edward Hughes, a locally renowned architect, who is responsible for many significant buildings in this area, including the vestry of St Peter's Parish Church in Huddersfield. He was also the first Fellow of the Royal Institute of British Architects in the Huddersfield area in 1868 and is now buried in St Paul's Churchyard in Shepley.
