
Allotment News

Mr Porter had a very difficult job choosing the winning allotments but we are very pleased to announce that Mrs Linda Gilbert was the winner at Grange Moor with Mrs Lynn Willis the runner up. Mr Raymond Horn was the winner at Shepley and the runners up were Mrs Christine Mellor and Mrs Trudy Mansfield. Allotment tenants were surprised to meet Mr Porter as the date of the judging

had been a closely guarded secret. Tenants who were tending their allotments at the time the judging was taking place chatted to Mr Porter and were offered helpful tips and advice. We are most grateful to Mr Porter for judging the competition and for sharing his knowledge and expertise with us.

included affect on wildlife, adverse impact on tourism and local businesses as well as highways safety.

The Council also supported Farnley Tyas residents' concerns to similar planning applications lodged in the village, when it registered strong objections to the proposed wind turbines and meteorological masts as they were too close to residents' houses and also caused a detrimental visual impact on the skyline. The Council was very pleased to learn that the applicant withdrew the 4 applications shortly before they were due to be considered by the Kirklees Planning Sub-Committee. However, the Council does not routinely object to every planning application for a wind turbine, each one is considered on its merits and the views of the local residents are always taken account of, before deciding whether or not to recommend approval of the application. The Council tends to support the smaller installations, especially if they support local businesses and farms, and if the location is suitable. The final decision is taken by Kirklees Planning Services.



Small Annual Grants Schemes & Community Project Grants

Yes, we're round again and it's time to think about applying for your annual small grant. Forms are available for download from the website. Alternatively you may request one from the office or from your local Parish Councillor. All voluntary groups in the area are entitled to up to £750 over 3 years – the 3 years counted are the year of application and the 2 preceding ones (the cheques were issued in April 2013 and April 2012). If you are unsure how much you can apply for, please ask the staff who will be happy to help you. The deadline for receiving completed forms with the necessary supporting information is Friday 25 October 2013. We cannot accept late entries under any circumstances.

Community project grant applications have the same deadline of 25 October. These grants are for larger projects, and must have a minimum total project cost of £3,000. The current policy is to award up to 50% of the total project cost. Forms are available from your Councillors, the website and the office. If you have any queries, please contact the staff who will be willing to help you with your application.



Chairman's Sponsored Walk On Saturday 19 October 2013 Leaves Flockton Green WMC car park at 1.30pm

Cllr Steve Beresford is holding a sponsored walk for the Forget Me Not Children's Hospice. It is a 4-mile circular walk named the Billy Sweep Saunter, nickname of local chimney sweep, William Guest who died in September 1889. He descended a shaft in a winding engine near Haigh Lane to get some clean water, but he was killed by the winding cage. A gravestone has been erected in his memory in Flockton. The walk takes in lots of interesting footpaths and passes places of historical interest, such as the ancient George & Dragon where Mummers performed their plays at Christmastime.

The walk starts and finishes at Flockton Working Men's Club. Participants are welcome to leave their cars in the club car park free of charge.

New Shelter for Shelley Recreation Ground

The young people in the Shelley School Pyramid have worked extremely hard designing a new youth shelter, and progressing the project at joint School meetings, and consulting with their school colleagues on proposals as they progressed. They were also totally responsible for the preparation and delivery of a presentation to a public meeting, as well as all the associated publicity material. Following feedback that the original preferred location for the shelter is not welcomed by the older people who live adjacent to the park, they have moved it futher down the hill where it will be out of sight of the bungalows and so less of an inconvenience, without interferring with the football pitches already there.

Shelley was chosen as Kirklees Youth Service's survey showed that there was a lack in provision in this area of Kirklees for 10-14 year olds and particularly amongst girls in that age group.

The final designs were prepared by an A-level student at Shelley College, who is hoping to study architecture at university. These meet all BS and health & safety standards – Kirklees Engineers & Leisure Services Managers were impressed at the high standard of the work. All that remains now is to obtain permission from Planning Services for the installation and to come to an agreement on the future maintenance and liability for the shelter. The Parish Council has given approval for the shelter to be installed subject to receipt of permissions from Kirklees.
