Council Precept Frozen for the 2nd Year



At its December meeting the Council agreed to freeze the precept for the second year. Accounting for inflation this is equivalent to a 4% cut. At this level the cost to a home in the Kirkburton Parish Area is £13.49 a year*.

This decision means there are no cuts to the Council's budget for grants and other services to villages and it also allows for a small grant to each village to contribute to the Queen's Diamond Jubilee celebrations.

1000 Fruit Tree Project Update



The Council aims to plant 1000 fruit trees throughout the Parish area. The first plantings will be this spring in Stocksmoor and at Grange Moor allotments. Further sites have been identified in Thurstonland, Farnley Tyas, Kirkheaton and Shelley, which we hope to plant up this autumn / winter. For planting to get the go-ahead village groups must be prepared to be involved with the planting and subsequent maintenance. Tree work at Kirkheaton Churchyard

A tree overhanging the road at Kirkheaton Churchyard has been recently identified as being a possible danger as it could have have fallen into the road.

The Council acted swiftly to remove the tree and is now going to review the whole area, with a view to removing unsafe trees and doing maintenance on the remainder.

New Public Seats in Kirkburton and Shepley

The Council provides a number of public seats within its area and has an ongoing schedule of maintenance of seats it provides. Kirkburton and Shepley are now due for new seats and the following suggestions have been made:

Kirkburton: Either to replace the broken seat towards the top of Linfit Lane or to install a bench on Moor Lane, opposite house no 98 between lamp posts 27 and 28.

Shepley: To put in a new seat by the war memorial. Below are photos of proposed sites in Moor Lane, Kirkburton (top) and Shepley War memorial (below).

Changes to the Grants Rules

Small Annual Grants: These are available to community / not-for-profit organisations in the Parish. Groups must provide a copy of their constitution or mission statement, latest financial statement for the previous financial year and details of their current balance. Annual grants are normally £250 per year or up to £750 over 3 consecutive years (including the year of application).

Start-Up Grants: Available to support new groups, which have been established for less than 1 year. Grants are up to £100. Groups must show evidence of a bank account and supply a copy of the constitution/mission statement.

Emergency Grants: Up to £750 available per year to the above organisations. Need to provide 1 quote, details of current bank balance, copy of constitution and the reason for the urgency.

Community Project Grants: To support projects with a total value of £3,000, current policy is that grants are normally restricted to up 50% of the project cost. Groups need to supply the documents listed above and also up to 3 quotes, depending on the value of the goods/ purchases.

Environment Grants: For environmental projects meeting at least one of the objectives on the Environment Plan. Groups need to supply the above documents and up to 3 quotes, depending on the value of the goods/purchases.

For all schemes, Groups must supply the documentation by the date notified and retrospective applications are not eligible. Forms and further information is available from the website and from the staff. Dates for the meeting dates after May will be set at the Council's Annual Meeting and will be uploaded to the website as soon as possible.



Obituary: Councillors were sad to learn of the death of past Chairman, Cllr Thelma Karran, who served the Shepley ward for 7 years and Kirklees Council for 8 years, including a period as Leader of the Conservative Group. She also sat as a JP. The Council paid tribute to the contributions she had made to this area and a request has been made to name a street after her when a suitable opportunity arises in Shepley.

Library Update: The Council is concerned at the threat to 3 of the 4 libraries in the Parish (Kirkheaton, Lepton and Shepley). Carol Stump, Kirklees Chief Librarian for South Kirklees, attended a Parish Council meeting to discuss the issues with the Councillors.

It seems that a public consultation will be taking place in all the affected areas, to find out how the necessary savings to the service can be found. The Parish Council fully supports the retention of this valuable service and has submitted these sentiments to the Government's Culture, Media & Sport Committee, which is currently investigating library closures.

The local Parish Councillors have attended the various public meetings in these villages to support the residents in their campaigns to maintain this local service.
