Mr Geoffrey Earnshaw

Members of the Parish Council were saddened to hear of the recent death of former Parish Council Chairman, Geoffrey Earnshaw. As well as being a long-serving member of the Parish Council and the Urban District Council, Mr Earnshaw also played a very active role in the community being a founder member both of the Shepley Conservative Association and the Shepley Evergreens. He was also an active member of the British Legion.

Mr Earnshaw was Parish Council Chairman twice in 1977 and 1987. We will all miss him and send our sincere condolences to Mr Earnshaw's family.

Staff Changes

Over the summer we were sad to see the retirement of Sandra Harling, who has been with the Council for 7½ years. Her enthusiasm for the work and her expertise in the areas of both HR and archaeology will be missed, but we hope that she will keep in contact with us and that the links which have been forged between the Council and the Huddersfield Archaeology Society will continue. Cllrs had a collection and presented her with an evening bag & shawl and Thornton's chocolate.

At the same time, we have been pleased to welcome Rachel Perry, who has taken up a new role in the Council. She is very experienced and previously worked at Huddersfield University in the International Office. As



well as fulfilling the usual administrative tasks, Rachel runs many of the Council projects. When she is qualified she will take over from the Clerk on the Environment Committee.

Drainage Improvements at Grange Moor Allotments

The Council runs two sets of allotments, one at Shepley and one at Grange Moor. The Grange Moor allotments are adjacent to the main Wakefield Road and have been suffering from serious flooding problems during the winter months. The Council has engaged contractors to eliminate this problem, by creating ditches to allow the water to drain away. The work has recently been completed



and hopefully the allotment holders have not been inconvenienced too much and will have flourishing vegetable plots next season. We would like to thank the tenants for their patience and the contractor for all his work. The Council is keenly interested in the local environment and considers thriving allotments as part of its long term plans.

Action to reduce Dog Fouling: A new Working Party has been set up with the aim of reducing the amount of dog fouling, which is a nuisance and health hazard affecting all areas of the Parish. We hope to work with Kirklees to provide waste bag dispensers in the worst affected areas and will also be running a publicity campaign to draw attention to the issue. If you have any ideas where you think a dispenser would be useful or have any other suggestions of how we could improve the situation, please let Rachel know. All ideas will be considered.

Kirkheaton Churchyard

As many of the residents of Kirkheaton will know, the Parish Council looks after the majority of the churchyard at St. John's Parish Church. Over the past few years we have been running a maintenance programme to address outstanding issues with walls, paths and trees. We have recently completed the repair of a section of the boundary wall in the older section of the churchyard and also repaired/relaid the small wall and adjacent path within the churchyard (pictured left). In the Spring we hope to repair the base of the Colne Bridge Memorial, erected in the memory of the 17



children, who died in the Atkinson's factory fire at Colne Bridge in 1818.

We would like to thank everyone involved, including the congregation for their co-operation when the work was being carried out, and particular thanks go to the contractor for such outstanding work. We hope the people who visit the churchyard are as pleased with work as we are. We have already received thanks and compliments from the Rector on behalf of the Church.

Community Project Grants Awarded:

- Lepton Highlanders: £3,400 towards drainage solutions.
- Kirkheaton Parish Centre Committee: £5,240 towards improvements to the building.
- Thurstonland Cricket Club: £1,500 towards a new cricket pitch.
- Kirkheaton Scouts & Guides: £2,500 towards replacement windows at the HQ.
